Court convened for a Special Called Meeting at the Courthouse, Henderson, KY, on Thursday January 13, 2022 at 3:00 p.m., County Judge/Executive Brad Schneider presiding.

Discussion of Fee-Pooling

Magistrate McCollom opened the discussion and spoke about the why and when Henderson County began fee-pooling in 1993. It seemed to him that by not having fee-pooling it would put a greater responsibility on the Sheriff and County Clerk on the management of their funds and relieve some of the county's responsibility.


Magistrate Puttman said that he called Frankfort to try and get a better understanding of the pros & cons. He was told that about 30 counties in the state fee-pool and was told a county would be crazy to relinquish that control and return to no fee-pooling.

County Clerk Renesa Abner said that she had spoken to a number of other clerks that do not fee pool and no two counties do it the same. Some clerks take care of their own payroll while others pay the treasurer's office to maintain the payroll for them. It was the same for the Sheriff Departments. Some get the fiscal court to purchase their vehicles while others purchase themselves.

Judge Schneider asked the Clerk and Sheriff of what their overall thought on the subject was. Both Renesa and Sheriff Crafton said they are comfortable with the way the system is currently set up and feel better with the Fiscal Court's oversight.


All the participants agreed they appreciated the discussion as it was a learning experience for all. The general consensus of the magistrates was to keep fee-pooling as it currently is.
